The estimated cost of producing the report on the potential domestic contribution to Aotearoa New Zealand's second nationally determined contribution (2024) is \$144,000. This cost was met through our baseline funding. The report was completed by Commission staff with an external expert engaged to review the report.

The report was agreed by the Commission's Board of Commissioners. The Commission did not convene a separate committee for this work.
